#### Comments to be provided:

From Jack Duncan and Tammy Duncan- Jack and Tammy are both self-employed, Jack is the owner of Jack Duncan Construction, LLC, a local remodeling business operated out of their home located in Platte City, Missouri; and Tammy Duncan is the owner of Tammy Duncan's Daycare, a licensed in-home daycare. Their home is currently serviced by Evergy.

Mr. Duncan has a small shop in which he provides custom work for his remodeling business that cannot be done without power. Ms. Duncan is unable to prepare hot meals, provide a space with heating and/or cooling for the children, nor complete some of the curriculum without power. The multiple recent power outages have created a great hardship to both small business owners.

For the 90 day time period from the end of May 2022 until the end of August 2022, the Duncans were without power to their home on seven different occasions. On one such occasion, the Duncans were without power for three consecutive days (June 8<sup>th</sup>, June 9<sup>th</sup> and June 10<sup>th</sup>).

At each outage, the Duncans would call and report the same; however, were provided generic responses and no solutions. The last phone call the Duncans had with Evergy they were told the outage was from squirrels crossing the lines. When the Duncans inquired with Evergy why the power outages were so frequent, the response given by Evergy was "There are a lot of squirrels out there."

Because of the lack of response by Evergy to the frequent outages, the Duncans have filed an Application with the Missouri Public Service Commission in an attempt to change their electric service provider to Platte Clay Electric. As a result of the filing, Evergy has indicated that it will attempt to provide a solution to the frequent outages experienced by the Duncans. It is unfortunate that it took filing an Application with the Missouri Public Service Commission to receive a response regarding a proposed solution.

It is my understanding you are accepting comments for the community forum re: Evergy power outages. I live on Atchison Ct. in Platte City. I will be at work during the meeting Monday morning and unable to attend in person.

Our electricity in Platte City is the least reliable electricity we have ever experienced. As a military family we have moved around quite a bit and have never worried about our electricity like we do here in Platte City. This summer we had several outages that lasted more than 24 hours. We have a deep freezer full of meat that we simply had to hope would not spoil during the multiple outages. As you know, grocery prices are so high that losing a freezer full of meat and food would be crippling for our family. Fortunately we are soon leaving the area. Frankly, if we ever get restationed in the area, we will reconsider living in Platte City because the electricity is so unreliable.

I appreciate you taking our comments to the meeting tomorrow morning.

- > Please pass this feedback along on Monday during the meeting:
- > We've lived in our house on Collins Drive for 18 years. We are looking to relocate and one of the requirements of the new home must be that the services do not come from Evergy. We've had a loss of power more times than I can count. It seems like if the wind blows even slightly, there's a risk that we will have no power. When we lost power this summer, we tried to salvage as much of the food in our refrigerators and deep freeze by relocating them to other friends' refrigerators/freezers. This was a massive nuisance and waste of several hundred dollars for the food that we could not save.
- > I telework from home, and have had to try to recover from the embarrassing loss of power by going to the library and McDonalds to work just to be able to participate in conference calls.
- > When nearly everyone else in town (even those living within a few blocks) have power, it is highly frustrating. We feel like bottom of barrel citizens.
- > I understand acts of nature like a massive ice storm, can mean no power. But mild wind is not a sufficient reason for such a lack of service.
